Personal Statements

- Your chance to stand out and be YOU. Why would you be a good person for the course. Show that you really want to be on that course, make the uni think you'll be interesting to teach.
- Hardest part is starting, don't try and start with an opening sentence, do that later. Use the links on website to help you
- 80% academic, link everything back to why it makes you perfect for the course.
- I have been/ study/ XXXXX, then ask yourself 'so what?', then answer with, therefore/ this lead me/ this has given me XX skills which I can apply to......etc.

- You'll end up with 5/10/15 drafts before you have perfected it!

Personal statements need to be started as soon as you know what course you want to study. If only to start thinking about what needs to go into them, and maybe thinking about how you can enhance them. This year will be difficult with work experience, but what about making use of all the online courses there are, many free at the moment, which will show you are really interested in the course you have chosen, and you are prepared to read around the subject for interest sake.

You will fill the empty space – just start!

- 3 subjects to talk about
- The course you have picked WHY?
- Independent study OUTLINE
- Mostly academic, but mention hobbies briefly
- Try to write it NOW, don't leave until September when you have loads to do at the start of term, you will feel very good if you have a good first draft soon.

You all study three subjects, which you can talk about. What skills have you learnt, what has particularly interested you in the course and why

What attracts you to the course you have chosen and why will you suit it. What independent study have you done for your subjects? Further reading/linked activities

Most of the personal statement should be academic, so don't worry if you don't have many hobbies to talk about.


Personal Statement - A B C rule It is important that your statement is not full of lists. Lists of what you have done or lists of skills you have. There is a way to avoid writing in this way - it is called the ABC rule **ACTIVITIES + BENEFITS + COURSE** Make each sentence evidence skills you have that are relevant to the course you want to study, by discussing a specific activity. ACTIVITY + BENEFIT + COURSE 'For one of my essays I decided to focus on For example: the history of British political thought. I ACTIVITY + BENEFIT really enjoyed this topic and look forward 'I had the chance to improve to studying it in more detail at a higher my research and essay writing 'I studied history' level. The experience I gained from skills whist completing my history A level' researching this subject and completing my essay I'm sure will help me in my degree course'

The ABC rule helps SO much, please try it. Write a list now and see how you get on, remember to say 'so what', after the A part, this will help you explain what doing that activity has given you in terms of skills and benefits and how it will help you on the course.



We haven't just made it up, lots of universities recommend it, because it works so well.






It goes through a selection of courses in alphabetical order, giving examples of personal statements, then gives you the strengths and weaknesses, this is very useful.
