 Meeting individual support and care needs the principles and practicalities that underpin meeting individuals' care and support needs.

There will be nine taught hours per fortnight in the department. Lessons will be based on discussion of key theories and concepts, leading to the production of effective classroom notes.

Year 13



In year 13, we build upon year 12 knowledge to explore the roles and responsibilities of Health and Social care professionals and bodies in further depth, analysing the importance of these in meeting the needs of individuals. In the coursework element we explore the body and associated health conditions, their diagnosis and treatment, giving students the chance to further develop research skills.

This is a two year course and in year 13 there will be eight taught lessons a fortnight. The focus will be on research, analysing and evaluating skills. There will be a mix of learning styles incorporated into the curriculum such as booklets, worksheets, written notes and mindmapping. There will be plenty of opportunities for extra exam practice and essay writing and there will be lots of learning by research outside of the lessons.

In addition to the extended (single) qualification the Diploma (double) explores the Health and wellbeing of individuals and the factors that affect this. It allows students to gain an understanding of health issues in the UK and the governments role in addressing these.

- Enquiries into Current Research in Health and Social Care— explore the methodologies of contemporary research and investigate the implications for health and social care practice and services.

In year 13 there will be eight taught lessons a fortnight. The focus will be on research techniques and current research topics for Health and Social Care.

We will also explore safe practice and the implications of this in Health and Social care settings.
